Do you run a business or are thinking of starting one? Depending on the type of business, you may need to register the premises with us. This is because council has responsibilities for protecting public health. The types of businesses that need to be registered with council include food premises, accommodation premises, and health premises. Health premises include hairdressers, sites that conduct ear and body piercing, tattooists, beauty treatments such as waxing and nails.
