



## Swimming pool safety

Swimming pools and spas, including inflatable and portable pools, need a safety barrier if the pool or spa is able to hold more than 30 centimetres of water.

Many of the inexpensive, portable above ground pools available at many shops legally require a fence that meets pool fence standards. The fence needs a building permit, which is available from a private building surveyor.

Council staff can inspect your pool to make sure the safety barrier meets requirements and there are no climbable areas near the barrier. To learn more about pool barriers, see the building section of our website.

## Drainage work in Orbost

Orbost residents are advised we are doing drainage work in Ruskin and Stanley streets. Work in Ruskin Street has begun and is expected to be finished in late February.

### Intention to sell land

The land is to be sold via private treaty to the adjoining land owner for consolidation with their existing allotment.
